Living in the present in the light of the future

We live in a time and a climate of much uncertainty. On many levels, every day, we face unknowns. What will the groceries cost today? tomorrow? next week? Can I find a job today? Will I have one tomorrow? Will I get accepted for school? Will I pass the exam? Can I stay in the country? Will I need medical care? Will I have to move? All these, and more, are questions on the personal level which can be unsettling.

In the wider landscape of life, there are even bigger questions. What more changes will artificial intelligence bring? What will a changing climate cause: drought or flood, or fire or ice? Can I travel safely — and if so, where? Will there be peace? What about war affecting family and friends, and countries all over the world? What freedom do we have, and what may we lose? So many questions ...

In His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gave the first disciples the key to living in uncertain days and circumstances.

Jesus said, “Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life? ... But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own. (Matthew 6:25-27; 33-34, NIV)

In the congregation I served in New Brunswick, there was a hymn that was a favourite for many people, because it brought assurance. It was written by Ira F. Stanphill, and entitled, “I know Who holds tomorrow”. It has a healthy perspective on life, and holds great wisdom for us as we live among the uncertainties and challenges we face:

I don't know about tomorrow,
I just live from day to day.
I don't borrow from its sunshine,
For its skies may turn to grey.
I don't worry o'er the future,
For I know what Jesus said,
And today I'll walk beside Him,
For He knows what is ahead.

Expanded Recycling Items

As of January 2026, a company called Circular Materials has taken over the collection and treatment of recyclable materials in Ontario. There are now some changes to the recycling programme: some additions have been made to the already extensive list of items that can be recycled. In all cases, containers and packaging should be empty and at least rinsed out before being put in the blue bin. Some items must have lids or caps on; others are to have lids or caps off. The following items have been added to the list of things that can be put in the **blue bin**.

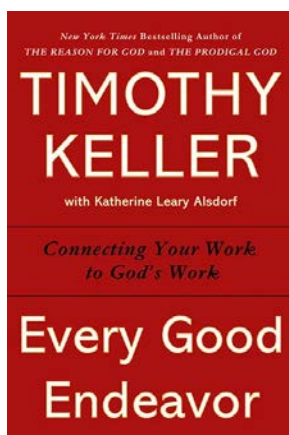
- Foam packaging, foam cups, foam plates, and foam meat trays (film wrap and absorbent pads removed and put in garbage) can now be recycled.
- Bags used for dry cleaning, bread bags, overwrap on packages of paper towel, toilet paper, beverage containers, etc. Coffee bags or deli pouches, chip bags, bubble wrap, snack wrappers, cereal liner bags, and plastic gift bags can all be recycled.
- Toothpaste tubes, hand cream tubes, and deodorant sticks can be recycled.
- Small plastic containers and plastic plant pots can be recycled.
- Aerosol containers (if non-toxic) can be recycled. Please refer to the website for exceptions.

Boxes put into the **black bin** are to be flattened.

Recycling is especially important given that Parkwood Church is charged \$4.40 for each bag of solid waste above the three-bag limit. Recycling responsibly is an important component of our Christian stewardship.

Good News

Both the primary and secondary loans can now be completely repaid. These loans were obtained to help finance the renovation and expansion of our current building.

Early in January, Parkwood received an anonymous gift-in-kind (sale of financial stocks) donation of \$26,437 directed to the Loan Repayment Fund. This donation together with the small reserve in the fund as of the end of 2025 means the two loans can be completely repaid. The outstanding principal for the two loans as of the end of 2025 was \$27,189.

Those members and adherents who have been donating to the repayment of the loans are encouraged to shift their donations to local purposes to help Parkwood meet its daily operating and program costs.

Mission Team Special Appeal

Hurricane Melissa, one of the strongest storms ever recorded in the Atlantic, has caused devastation across the Caribbean. Strong winds and heavy rain left houses destroyed, roads submerged and bridges collapsed. Dozens of people across Cuba, Haiti and Jamaica have lost their lives.

Damage assessments are taking place and ACT Alliance members in Cuba and Haiti are evaluating next steps. In the immediate term, access to food, shelter, water and hygiene supplies, and psychosocial support will be essential. Longer term recovery will have to include livelihoods support and reconstruction.

Presbyterian World Service and Development (PWS&D) is able to respond through our partners at ACT Alliance. Donations can be made through our offerings at Parkwood, designated for Mission Appeal #1, 2026 - PWS&D Caribbean Hurricane Relief.

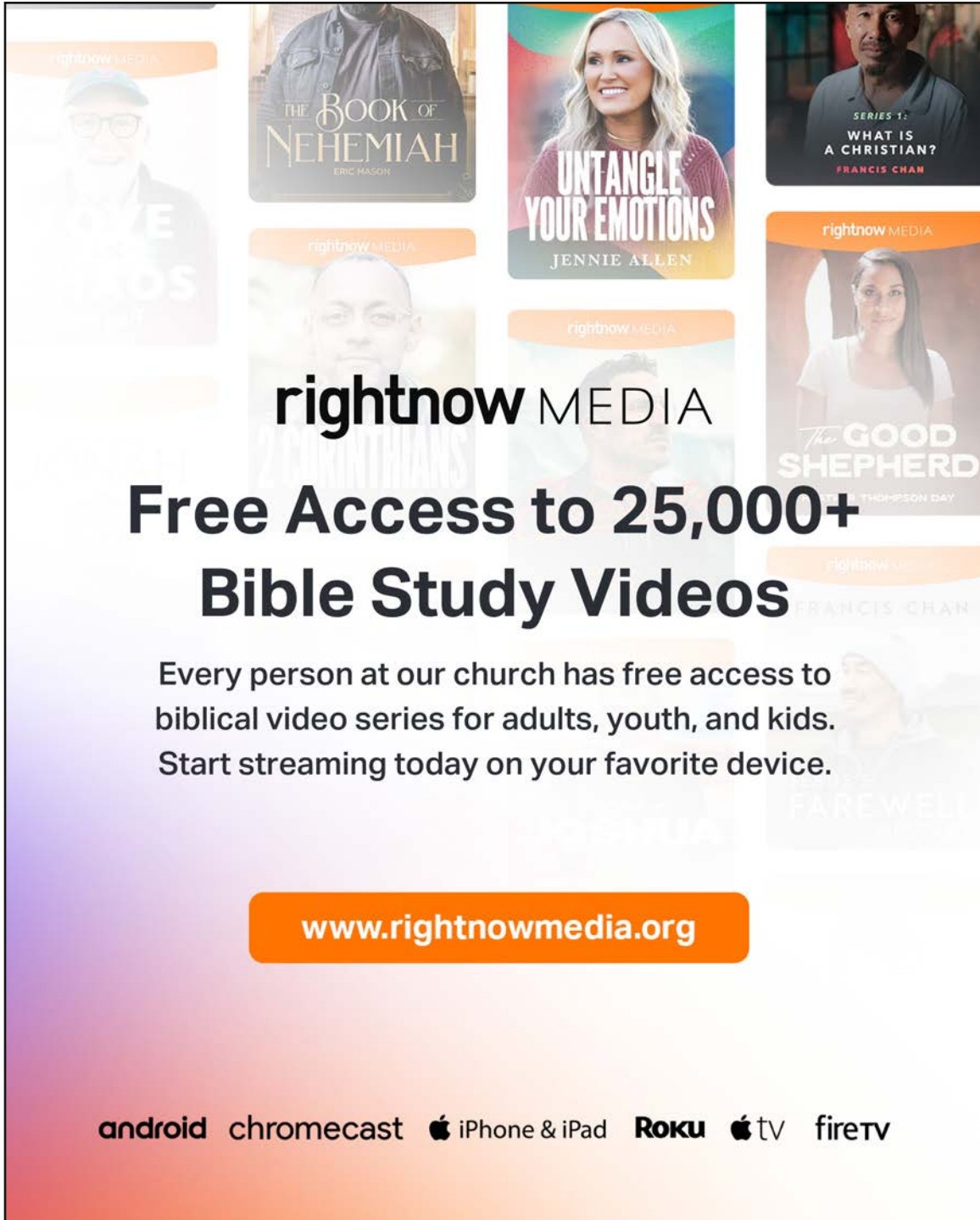
December Pause Table
